BYLAW # 04/2016

A BYLAW OF THE VILLAGE OF PARADISE HILL TO PROHIBIT THE DISCHARGE OF FIREARMS

The Council of the Village of Paradise Hill in the Province of Saskatchewan, hereby enact as follows:

1. This bylaw shall be referred to as the "Discharge of Firearms Bylaw".
2. For the purpose of this Bylaw "firearms" means a pistol, revolver, rifle, shotgun or any other device or mechanism capable of firing or propelling bullets, pellets, darts, arrows or any other thing by means of an explosive.
3. Subject to section 3 hereof, no person shall discharge any firearm within this village.
4. The Council may authorize an officer of the Village, in writing, to issue to a recognized gun club or similar organization a permit, in writing, entitling it to operate for the purpose of supervised target practice or similar activities in the Village.
5. No such club or organization as set out in section 3 hereof, shall operate at any time without such a permit, and the person in charge shall produce and exhibit his permit when requested to do so by any municipal constable, license inspector or other authorized person.
6. Any person found guilty of an infraction of any of the provisions of this bylaw shall be liable to the penalties provided in the general bylaw of this village.
7. Contravention of the Bylaw
 - a. Every person who contravenes any provision of this Bylaw is guilty of an offence and liable on summary conviction to a fine of \$1000.00.
 - b. Where the Designated Officer believes that a person has contravened any provision of this Bylaw, he may serve upon such person a Bylaw Violation Notice as provided by this section either personally or by mailing or leaving same at his last known address and such service shall be adequate for the purpose of this Bylaw.
 - c. Such notice shall be deemed to have been served:
 - i. on the expiration of three days after it is posted, if the notice is mailed;
 - ii. on the day of actual delivery, if the notice is served personally; or
 - iii. on the business day following the transmission, if given by facsimile.
 - d. Schedule "A" to this bylaw is the form to be used for a "Bylaw Violation Notice" given under Section 7 a).
 - e. The person to whom a Bylaw Violation Notice was issued may make a voluntary payment of \$1000.00, deposited with the Administrator of the Municipality, within twenty 20 days from the issue of the Bylaw Violation Notice. Upon payment of said voluntary payment, the person shall not be liable for prosecution for the contravention in respect of which the ticket was issued.
 - f. Where any person contravenes the same provision of this Bylaw two or more times within one twelve month period, the specified voluntary payment payable in respect of the second or subsequent contravention is double the voluntary payment for the first offense.

8. Bylaw No. 2 – 76 is hereby repealed.
9. This bylaw shall come into force and take effect on the date of the final passing thereof.
