Reading Water Meters:

Do you know where your meter is located in your home?

It's important to make sure that it is not blocked or tampered with so it can be read. Water meters in the Village are read via radio meter. We do not require access to your dwelling. If the meter shows an error or a high water consumption, we will contact you to check if you have a water leak.

Slow leaks in toilets account for most high water readings. In the summer months, watering gardens and filling swimming pools also account for high readings.

Dog License Fees: All dogs in the Village are required to have a license.

- \$35 for a new dog licence.

- \$35 for renewal Jan 1 - Feb 28. After Feb 28 renewal fee is \$40.00.

CATS: The Village does not have a Cat Bylaw. They don't require a license.

2025 Property Tax Reminder:

Property Tax Penalty/ Discounts:

Property taxes unpaid as of January 1, 2026 are subject to a 10% penalty. A penalty rebate of 4% is available on the municipal portion of any tax arrears paid before February 28, 2026. Note that property tax can be paid through the Synergy Credit Union online banking system, E-transfer to paradiseshill@sasktel.net or you can arrange for taxes to be paid with an annual or monthly automatic debit from any bank or credit union.

Property Tax & Water Bill Payment Options:

The Village offers multiple payment options to assist residents in paying their taxes and water bills in a timely manner.

Payment Options include:

- In office cash, cheque or debit
 - Synergy Credit Union online banking system
 - E-transfer to paradiseshill@sasktel.net
 - Annual or monthly automatic debit from any bank or credit union.
- (Authorization forms are available at the Village Office)

Water Bill Email Option:

Development/Building Permits:

Does your next construction project require a permit?

Many common improvements to your property may require a permit:

- New builds (Fence, shed, garage or dwelling)
- Demolitions, repairs or alterations to an existing structure
- Moving structures on or off your property

All applicable permits are to be in place before any work has been started.

Winter Snow Removal:

The Village reminds residents to remove their campers, trailers and extra vehicles from the streets and back alleys to help facilitate the removal of ice and snow in a timely manner during the winter months. If you have a sidewalk by your property, it would be appreciated if you would keep your sidewalk clear of ice and snow to make it safe for residents to walk.

Water Lines Freezing:

It is the responsibility of each Village resident to ensure that they are using enough water to prevent water lines from freezing. If you are away from home have someone check your home and turn on taps and run the water for a short period of time.

The Village will not thaw out water lines.
