Property Tax Discounts:

Discounts are applied to the municipal portion of property taxes: For taxes paid on or before:

September 30-3%

October 31-2%

November 30-1%

Taxes not paid by December 31 will have a 10 % penalty added on January 1, 2024

Property Tax & Water Bill Payment Options:

The Village offers multiple payment options to assist residents in paying their tax and water bills in a timely manner.

-Synergy Credit Union online banking system

-Annual or monthly automatic debit from any bank or credit union. (Authorization forms are available at the Village Office)

Be a Responsible Pet Owner!

- License your Dog
- Pick up after your pet. Dog & Cat waste is a health and environmental hazard
- Don't let you dogs/cats roam onto other peoples property

Dog License Fees: All dogs in the Village are required to have a license.

-\$35 for a new dog licence.

-\$35 for renewal Jan 1 - Feb 28. After Feb 28 renewal fee is \$40.00.

Dog Bylaw #02/2016 can be found on the Village website under "Governance."

CATS: The Village does not have a Cat Bylaw. They don't require a license.

It's Back to School time!

That means more traffic, school buses and people walking or biking to school.

To help share the roads safely and keep everyone stay safe this school year:

* Observe school zone speed zones and designated parking spots

* Watch for darting and running children

* Do not pass a school bus with flashing lights or the arm down



Development/Building Permits:

Does your next construction project require a permit?

Many common improvements to your property may require a permit:

- New builds (Fence, shed, garage or dwelling)

-Demolitions, repairs or alterations to an existing structure

-Moving structures on or off your property

All applicable permits are to be in place before any work has been started.

Marsh and Walking Trail Litter:

Over the summer the Village Office received complaints about garbage, tires and other debris being left on the walking path, in the marsh area or thrown into the creek. Signage has also been placed on the bridge as ATV's and Dirt bikes are prohibited.

Please keep our marsh and walking trail clean for everyone to enjoy!

Summer and Water Consumption:

During the summer months most water bills increase due to watering lawns, gardens & filling swimming pools. Sometimes high consumption comes from leaking toilets, taps or wash machines. A leaking toilet can use 100's of gallons of water and is usually the main reason for large steady increases in water consumption. We will contact you if we notice high consumption when reading your water meter.
